When an employer needs to hire a worker, the first thing the employer will do is write a help wanted advertisement to let job seekers know: 1) About the restaurant. 2) Job title. 3) Job duties. 4) Education, skills, and work experience needed (known as qualifications). To learn how to read help wanted ads, study the following job openings posted by online on websites by restaurant managers.
