What Can I Say? Activities!

Transferrable skills are **talents**, **abilities**, **and knowledge** you learn by **experiences**, **hobbies**, **sports**, **or school** that are needed by workers in all jobs. Managers look to hire job seekers who have transferable skills such as: teamwork, time management, responsibility, communication, human relations (empathy and tact), and leadership. Co-curricular (during school day) and extracurricular (outside school day) activities teach you transferrable skills. **When you join groups**, **clubs**, **sports**, **and work as classroom aide**, **you learn to**: 1) work as a team member; 2) control — manage — your time to do what needs done; 3) act responsible towards others; 4) exercise listen and talk (communication) skills; 5) practice empathy (understand how another feels); 6) practice tact (say and do the right thing); and 7) practice leadership skills when you take charge of a task. On a resume, include activities that show you have transferrable skills.
